
Season Update

Welcome: Greenock CC

Today we welcome current champions Greenock to Grange Loan. Two time winners of the Premier League and, before that, 17 times winners of the Western Union, Greenock have always been one of Scotland's leading clubs.

With only 9 points separating the sides in the league table today's match is sure to be a keenly contested affair. Unfortunately for us, the recent history of Greenock v Carlton clashes has very much gone the way of the Renfrewshire side.

Most memorably, the sides clashed in last season's Scottish Cup Final at Paisley when Greenock won a low scoring match thanks, in the main, to a key all round contribution from ex-Carlton star Craig Wright. That day Carlton under achieved with the bat and struggled to 99 all out. In reply, our opponents were in deep trouble at one point before Wright and ex-Carlton junior Sean Weeraratna steered their side home.

In the league this season, Carlton returned from Greenock with only 2 points as they failed to chase down 289 despite a battling 92 from Fraser Watts. Richie Berrington was the top scorer for the home side with 95. Neither player will feature today as both Watts and Berrington are in the Scotland Twenty20 squad for the World Cup Qualifiers in Ireland.

To find Carlton's last win against Greenock we need to go back to the beginning of last season at Glenpark, when a 5 wicket haul from Charles Leggett helped to dismiss Greenock for just 194. A fine unbroken partnership between Peter Wooden (76) and Jamie Kerr (60) saw the visitors to a seven wicket win.
